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# SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

Hazards from the substance or mixture

: Flammable liquid and vapour. Runoff to sewer may create fire or explosion hazard. In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst, with the risk of a subsequent explosion. This material is toxic to aquatic life with long lasting effects. ### 5.3 Advice for firefighters

**Small spill**

### **Protective measures**
