Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Small spill

Section 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling

Appropriate engineering controls

Formaldehyde is a known cancer hazard, a skin sensitizer and a respiratory sensitizer. If splashed in the eyes, the liquid may cause irritation and reversible damage.
