# Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

# **Small spill**

Alternatively, or if water-insoluble, absorb with an inert dry material and place in an appropriate waste disposal container. Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor.

#### Large spill

Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. # 7. Handling and storage

# **Precautions for safe** handling

# procedures

## Other information
